

REGULATIONS FOR TEACHING COURSES IN PATHOPHYSIOLOGY
FOR SECOND-YEAR STUDENTS OF MEDICINE
ENGLISH DIVISION
Summer semester of the academic year 2023/2024

1. The pathophysiology timetable includes 30 hours of lectures and 45 hours of tutorials.
2. Information on didactics is posted on the Department of Pathophysiology notice board and the website of the Department of Pathophysiology (<https://www.wf.cm.umk.pl/katpatofiz/english-division/>).
3. All classes are held following the schedule established by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine on the dates set for each didactic group.
4. A change of the group by a student is possible only with a shift in the dean's group, approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine.
5. Tutorials and lectures are held in the classroom indicated in the timetable.
6. The presence of students during the tutorials is obligatory. Each absence should be excused, and the tutorial should be worked out after agreeing with the tutor, which should take place within seven days from the date on which the cause of the absence ceased to exist.
7. It is the responsibility of each student to prepare for the current tutorial based on the provided literature.
8. Each student must prepare one project/multimedia presentation from the previously selected thematic block, which is necessary to pass the tutorials in pathophysiology.
9. In pathophysiology lectures 5, 9, and 14, partial tests are carried out according to the given schedule.
10. The verification of the learning outcomes in pathophysiology is based on the following criteria:

Percentage of points earned	Grade
$92 \leq \dots \leq 100 \%$	Very good (5)
$88 \leq \dots < 92 \%$	Good plus (4.5)
$80 \leq \dots < 88 \%$	Good (4)
$71 \leq \dots < 80 \%$	Satisfactory plus (3.5)
$60 \leq \dots < 71 \%$	Satisfactory (3)
$0 \dots < 60 \%$	Fail (2)

11. Pathophysiology classes end with the final exam, including the material of tutorials and lectures. The condition for admission to the exam is passing all three partial tests.
12. Sick leave due to the absence from the partial test, and the exam must be presented within seven days from the date of their completion via USOS email.
13. In the case of e-mail contact, the student must use an e-mail address with the domain @stud.umk.pl.
14. The Head of the Department of Pathophysiology, prof. dr hab. Ewa Żekanowska admits students every Wednesday between 12.00-13.30.
15. The teaching assistant is dr hab. Artur Słomka, prof. NCU. Consultations with students take place every Friday from 08:00-09:30.
